What are the Compact for Success Requirements?


Students need to be in the Sweetwater Union High School District <u>continuously</u> from grades 9th – 12th.

1st requirement...



• Complete all the A-G courses required for CSU admissions.

Maintain a CSU Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 and higher in A- G courses



- Attend meetings at school



Clear Math Remediation

- SAT 550
- ACT 23
- AP Calculus or AP Statistics Score of 3 or better
- EAP Score of Exempt
- EAP Score of Conditional Exempt – must be enrolled in an approved math class in Senior Year


4th requirement....



Clear English Remediation

- SAT score of 500
- ACT score of 22
- AP English Score of 3 or better
- EAP Score of Exempt
- EAP Score of Conditional Exempt – Must complete specific English class

5th requirement



• Take the SAT and/or ACT tests

College tests...

Obtain a minimum CSU Eligibility of 2900 for SAT or 694 for ACT

7th requirement

If you use your SAT score: (High School GPA X 800) + (SAT Critical Reading + Math Score) = Eligibility Index

If you use your ACT score
 (High School GPA X 200)
 + (10 X ACT Composite Score)
 = Eligibility Index

Meet all SDSU Admission/Enrollment deadlines

File application between October 1 and November 30 No "D" or "F" grades in Senior Year Submit their intent to enroll by May 1st


